Motion carried. City clerk will forward resumes to city council members as they are received. First review of resumes will be November 1, 2022.

Diana Conrad addressed the city council regarding lights for the basketball court. She is concerned about the light shining on her house and inquired if the lights would be on timers and turn off at night.

Public works employee Joe Enos requested permission to purchase two safety green jackets. The city council also discussed uniform shirts. The culvert on Ethel Street has been replaced. Trail restrooms are closed and park restrooms will be closed next week. Enos will begin clearing trees and vegetation from the drainage ditch south of the post office.

The city council discussed bushes overgrowing the sidewalk on Main Street. The city council inquired about the status of the abatement letter sent for 606 South Street. Dale Rogers had asked a city council member if a culvert could be installed in front of his property on Sarah Street.

The city clerk reported a citizen had expressed concern about the number of feral cats in town.
